Programmes

Academics

At ACS (International), students follow a general academic programme in their first two years before selecting their subject combinations for the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) in Year 3 and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 5. Some students sit for the Cambridge 'O' Level in their mother tongue languages.

The school offers an English-medium curriculum plus Second Language Bridging classes at Year 1, Year 2 and Year 4. This programme is offered to students taking English as an Additional Language (EAL). Bridging students usually join mainstream classes the following year.

A one-year Foundation programme (Foundation IB) to prepare for the IBDP is available to competent English Language learners who are unable to sit for the twoyear IGCSE.

An externally-run preparation course for SATs is provided for students aiming for entrance into universities in the United States of America.



Year 1 and Year 2

All students in Year 1 and Year 2 take general courses that include either a foreign language or Mother Tongue Language.

Year 3 and Year 4 (IGCSE)

All students in Year 3 and Year 4 follow an eightor nine-subject programme for two years before sitting for the final IGCSE examinations. Students follow a core curriculum of Mathematics, English Language or English as a second language, one Science, one Humanities, their Mother Tongue or Foreign Language (as per the School Language Policy) and Physical Education (PE).

Students also choose two additional subjects from the list below. Selected students may also take a third Science course for a nine-subject combination.

Mathematics

 Biology/Chemistry/ Physics Year 5 and Year 6 (IBDP)

The IBDP is a rigorous post-secondary academic programme that seeks to develop the students intellectually, physically, emotionally and ethically. To gain both depth and breadth of knowledge, Year 5 and Year 6 students take six subjects: one subject per group and three Core elements; Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge and Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) over the course of two years. Three subjects are taken at Higher Level and three subjects at Standard Level.

Caring

We have a commitment to service, and we act to make a positive difference in the lives of others and in the world around us.

The School Pastoral System

We seek to ensure that all students feel cared for and valued. The pastoral care system encourages and reinforces a student's personal and social development.

The House system is central to the school's pastoral provision and provides the means by which each student is nurtured. Each student is a member of a House and has a teacher Tutor who is primarily responsible for their pastoral care. Tutors oversee their students' conduct in school, monitor their academic work and encourage the highest standards. They help develop their tutees' character by observing the latter's relationships with other students. They enforce discipline and offer guidance and counselling. Each Head of House oversees these interactions between students, parents and staff, and contribute where necessary. The Holland Village Methodist Church Pastor and two full-time Christian ministry staff are located onsite for counselling and support.

A specialist Guidance Counsellor provides expert support where needed. The School Nurses, the Higher Education Counsellor and the Learning Support Officer also provide specialist assistance where necessary. The International Student Pastoral Care Counsellor (ISPCC) looks after the wellbeing and pastoral care of all of our international students.

Communication

Regular communication between home and school is encouraged. Should a student require assistance, parents or students are encouraged to email their respective teacher, Tutor or Head of House. If necessary, interventions at a higher level can be requested by senior staff.

Service

We regard service to the community — local or international — as a fundamental part of the Christian faith. It complements a student's intellectual development and their academic curriculum. Service is at the core of our mission and all students are expected to contribute. Service positively impacts both the individual undertaking the service activity and the one receiving the service.

Our students are able to participate in service activities in Singapore and overseas. Our students frequently make trips to Zimbabwe, Thailand, Vietnam, Malaysia, Indonesia, Cambodia, Nepal, India and Japan. There, students work on construction and conservation projects, assist in classroom teaching, clean-up activities, and activities that provide support to the old and the very young.



Life at ACS (International)

Our Community

We regard ourselves as a family. The concept of family is important to all cultures, and in this diverse and inclusive school our unique pastoral care-linked House system and our emphasis on Christian values supports, encourages and challenges all students to achieve their potential in every aspect of school life.

We are very proud of the extensive range of opportunities and challenges which contributes to the all-round holistic education prized by the school community.

Academic activities are complemented by a wide range of co-curricular activities (CCAs); an extensive leadership programme; service and community project activities undertaken both locally and overseas; and life skills which permeate the curriculum and co-curriculum in order to develop character, confidence, resilience in our future leaders and global citizens.



Boarding Life

International students may board at either ACS (Independent) or ACS Oldham Hall hostels, or stay in an approved home-stay after their first year.

Staying in boarding provides students with the structure they need to be successful as they transition to Singapore. Each of the boarding facilities provides adult oversight of the students, including organising special events and supervised study in the evenings. Both hostels offer comprehensive accommodation packages that include laundry services, food and pastoral care programmes to support our international students.



Houses

The House system is the cornerstone of the school's pastoral network. Each student is allocated to one of eight school Houses under the leadership of the Head of House, House Tutors and student House Prefects. The smaller student numbers of 130 per House enables a strong family environment to be maintained. Each student is known by name to their House leaders.

A friendly yet competitive rivalry between the Houses is encouraged through the various Inter-House activities that occur throughout the year.



Leadership

Developing servant leadership is at the heart of our mission. We seek to equip, enable and empower our students to serve others and lead change. Embracing the Design for Change disposition, they collaborate in small groups to bring improvements to the school community.

Every year students are appointed to serve as School Prefects, House Prefects, CCA leaders and Peer leaders. School Prefects are appointed from among the senior students while the other leadership positions are open to other year groups. The School Prefect board, led by the Head Boy and Head Girl and assisted by Deputy Heads, is appointed yearly in April to serve for the next 12 months. The School Prefects are assigned to sub-committees like Ambassadors, Council, Welfare and House. The House Prefects are appointed by the Housemasters and House staff while the CCA leaders are appointed by the CCA teachers.

To recognise their leadership development and practice, Leadership Colours Awards are presented yearly to students who have been a positive influence and made significant contributions to the community within and/or outside school.



Co-curricular Activities

Promoting an all-round holistic education, we complement our academic activities with a wide range of 40 different CCAs, including sports, the performing arts, and special interest programmes. There is an emphasis on both participation and performance, plus the development of leadership skills and character-building. The duality of the schools status as both an International School and MOE school means that athletes at ACS (International) can compete in both the ACSIS (Athletic Conference of Singapore International Schools) leagues and the MOE's National School Games competitions.

Oldham Chapel

ACS (International) is located in peaceful and picturesque Holland Village, close to Orchard Road. The school has been completely renovated and new building blocks added since its establishment in January 2005. All rooms are air-conditioned and equipped for Wi-Fi.

The 500-seat Oldham Chapel is used by the school for Chapel and large meetings, and by the Holland Village Methodist Church as its place of worship on Sundays.

In addition to general classrooms, the school features 15 science laboratories plus resource rooms; two specialist music classrooms plus music technology computer laboratory and four music practice rooms; a modern sports hall which is fully air-conditioned and fitted with two basketball

courts and a climbing wall; a Fitness Gym; two tennis courts; a 550-seat canteen serving Chinese, Western and Vegetarian cuisines, and snacks; a nursing station; and offices for the Counsellor, Higher Education Counsellor, Learning Support Officer and International Student Pastoral Care Counsellor.

The six-storey library block contains two storeys of library space plus two floors of general classrooms, one floor for three specialist art rooms and computer laboratory, and one floor for drama/theatre. The drama floor contains a black box, resource space and general classrooms.

The artificial astro turf, which covers a full-sized football field is a popular venue for curriculum, CCAs, lunch time and after-school activities.

Tan-Lim Siew Hoon has taught and served as a subject head for History in Singapore schools, including River Valley High School and ACS (Independent), before joining ACS (International) in 2005 as one of the pioneering batch of teachers.
