Choosing your course

UWA College's pathway programs are tailored to provide international students with support and additional academic and English language guidance, helping you meet the requirements for entry to UWA. As UWA's own pathway provider, you'll become a UWA student from the first day of your UWA College studies, before progressing into the first or second year of a range of UWA undergraduate degrees.

English language courses for pathway programs

UWA College English language courses are provided by UWA's Centre for English Language Teaching (CELT). If you need to improve your English skills for a pathway program, UWA CELT offers high-quality English language tuition in a supportive and friendly environment.

Language and Communication Essentials

UWA CELT's Language and Communication Essentials (LCE) program is designed to improve your English language skills and prepare you for further academic study at UWA College.

To meet UWA College's minimum English language requirements, there are two options for packaging your English language program at UWA CELT:

Option 1:

If you've achieved an overall IELTS score of 5.0 or equivalent, your language program can be packaged with your chosen UWA College pathway and UWA degree. This option gives you everything you need under a single study plan and visa, so you won't have to take another language test on completion.

Option 2:

If your overall IELTS score is less than 5.0, you'll need a longer English language program to meet the requirements for entry into a UWA College pathway program. In this case, UWA College will provide you with two separate study plans, one for a standalone English language course and one for your packaged UWA College pathway and UWA degree. With multiple start dates throughout the year, you'll be able to finish your English language course in time to enrol in your UWA College academic program.

What will I learn?

You'll learn English skills through:

- discussing interesting topics and taking part in conversations
- reading and understanding English texts
- writing clearly and accurately
- listening to different varieties of spoken English
- learning how to use correct grammar and vocabulary.

UWA Foundation Program progression options

The UWA Foundation Program offers students progression to all undergraduate courses at UWA. On the successful completion of your UWA Foundation Program, you could progress to a range of UWA courses, including:

Comprehensive degree: choose one or two majors from a wide range of offerings, then add electives and/or a minor to suit your interests and career goals.

Specialised degree: take an extended major with a carefully designed study plan to give you in-depth knowledge of your chosen career.

Combined Bachelor's degree: complete two degrees in just four years, one comprehensive and one specialised.

Combined Bachelor's and Master's degree: start postgraduate-level studies in the third year of your bachelor's degree and complete two degrees in four years.

Integrated Honour's degree: these four-year courses include advanced coursework and a major research or creative project in your final year.

Professional postgraduate degrees in medicine, dentistry and more

High-achieving students who successfully complete their UWA Foundation Program may be eligible for one of UWA's **Assured Pathways**. These pathways may increase your career opportunities in professional areas such as medicine, law, architecture and more, guaranteeing your place in the professional postgraduate degree of your choice at the start of your studies (subject to satisfactory performance in your bachelor's degree). Combining an undergraduate and postgraduate degree, Assured Pathways typically have higher progression grades.
